

August 11, 2014

The Warren Township Supervisors met at the Municipal Building at 5:00 PM. All were present. Chairman Mark Wheaton opened the meeting with the flag salute being given.

The secretary's minutes were read and approved. Mark made a motion to accept the minutes as read and Jerry seconded.

The treasurer's report was given as follows:

Plgit General - \$1180.47

First Citizens Savings - \$13835.82

PSB Impact Account - \$532180.47

State Account - \$34464.03

PSB State Account - \$150132.18

Jerry made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as given and Fred seconded.

OLD BUSINESS

The corrected Flood Plain Ordinance was received from Leslie Rhodes and approved by our solicitor, Chad Salsman. The Ordinance has been duly advertised and will be signed at the September 8 meeting. This ordinance is approved by Code Inspection.

The contract we requested from Codes Inspections has not been received. Another e-mail was sent requesting that today.

The check for \$15,000 was signed and will be sent to Little Meadows Ambulance Association.

The signage for the park is almost completed. Fred and Janice traveled to meet with a representative from Haas landscaping to prepare a directory for the park. All other work is completed and approval should be on track for October 15, 2014.

The link for the Floodplain information has been posted on the Warren Township Website.

The hand rails for the Municipal Building Hallways discussed at the June meeting have been made and installed by Lawrence Welch at a cost of \$1500.00.

The letter from the Bradford County Commissioners regarding the Endless Mountain Visitors Bureau (the commissioners would like to start a bureau exclusively for Bradford County) was once again discussed. The commissioners had sent a resolution for the supervisors to sign stating they would be in favor of this newly formed bureau. The supervisors voted unanimously against this resolution.

NEW BUSINESS

A report was received from the fire company showing the income and expense from the Field Days. The game buildings have been restored using funds for materials from the fire company and labor expense supplied from the township. This renovation is a major improvement to the grounds. Thanks to everyone involved.

ROAD MASTER REPORT

The ditch on Jones Road has had R-3 rock and non-woven geotextile material added. Talisman has put materials on Bowen Road. Work has been started on pipes at the end of Thomas Road.

At this point in the meeting Mr. John Heany came with a representation of several people from Runyon, Carey and LeRaysville Roads. They had come because of the dusty condition of Cary and Runyon Roads and their concern for the safety and health of the people living on those roads.

Their concerns were heard and they were told that the condition would be taken care of immediately with calcium chloride being put on the roads.

Mr. Heany and Mr. Infusino also expressed concern about the rocks that were brought into Pendleton Creek during the storm of 2011. They felt the township should remove these rocks. They were told by the supervisors that the waterways and stones in them is problem that needs to be addressed to the DEP.

The meeting then continued with the bills being reviewed and paid.
