The Warren Township supervisors met at the municipal building for their regularly scheduled meeting. Chairman, Mark Wheaton, opened the meeting with the flag salute being given. All were present. Visitors present were Craig and Glenn Wolfe.

The Secretary's report was read and accepted. Mark made a motion to accept and Bill seconded.

Mark made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented and Fred seconded.

OLD BUSINESS

The Wolfes came to the meeting to discuss their road as had been presented to them as discussed in the last meeting. They are requesting to leave the road as it is with No Winter Maintenance Signs and Road closed sign at both ends. It was discussed where to place the Road Closed Signs as the UPS trucks and Federal Express Trucks would not be able to go down the road if the sign was posted at the top of the road. It was stated by Mark Wheaton that the Road closed sign would be placed after the turn into the driveway.

Beaver Valley has installed our new phone lines. The Senior Center decided to switch to Beaver Valley also. There was an additional charge for the modem of \$40.00 and it will be an additional charge for them to be on the bill from Beaver Valley. They will pay the township the \$40.00 and the additional \$20 per month will be added to their rent check.

Bill made a motion to let Repsol go forward with paving the road on Abell Road and Montrose Turnpike. Mark Wheaton seconded. We will be required to put a seal coat on in 5 years.

NEW BUSINESS

Bill Franklin suggested we check with Beaver Valley to see if they install security cameras.

Clean-Up Day for the township will be April 21, 2018 from 8 am – 1 pm.

The supervisors voted to refund Ronald Dewing for the charges he incurred taking the courses to be the Tax Collector for Warren Township. The cost was \$200.00.
