OLD BUSINESS

We received a letter from our solicitor regarding abandoning Glen-Mar Road. It can be abandoned if all parties owning land on the road agree. If not, the township could take further action. Also, there has to be an ordinance in place before it can be abandoned. Discussion was held regarding possibly bringing the road up to required specifications to get Liquid Fuels and maintain it as a township road. Both of these plans will be tabled until it can be researched further.

Jan checked with Beaver Valley and they do not have a security system to install.

Plans are moving forward for Clean-Up Day. Posters have been placed in the Post Office and Store. A notice has been placed on the marquee out front. We are able to accept electronics this year. Only computers and their accessories will be accepted for recycle. Everything else has to go into the trash bins. There will be a \$5 charge for refrigerators. Tires will be charged as follows: Tires - \$3.50, Truck tires- \$5.50, Tractor tires - \$25.50.

Ron Dewing was reimbursed for the cost of the courses required for him to be a tax collector in the amount of \$200.00

NEW BUSINESS

A discussion was held regarding salt brine. There has been a hold placed on spreading salt brine by the state. Fred is looking in to alternate materials.

We have had a complaint from a resident about someone driving excessively on the township road where they reside. They brought a report from the State Police regarding placing speed limit signs. There are many factors involved in placing speed limit signs on township roads, the largest one being cost because of the many signs which would need to be placed. We will seek advice from Municipal Services and the State police.

There was no correspondence needing attention.

ROAD MASTER REPORT

The men are still plowing and cindering! Also, they are working on the 1991 Ford. A new box was purchased and the men are working to get it in good working order.

All bills were reviewed and paid.
