The Warren Township Supervisors met at the Municipal Building for their regularly scheduled meeting. Gerald Abell was absent. Chairman Mark Wheaton opened the meeting with the flag salute being given. The secretary's minutes were read and approved. Fred made a motion to accept and Mark seconded.

He called the Foster Law Offices to complain and see what could be done to stop the encroachment. Mr. Jonathan Foster is the solicitor for Warren Township. He called our office to see what could be done to alleviate the problem. Fred called Mr. Strickland to ask him to ride up to Reagan Road to see the pipe that had been put in there. He agreed to go, liked the way the pipe looked and agreed to let us proceed. He called again and changed his mind, wanted the pipe to be shorter. Once again he called the solicitor who informed him it would be a conflict of interest for him to proceed with Mr. Strickland. At this point, Mr. Strickland agreed to continue with the work as originally planned.

A resolution to accept the changes to the by-laws to Eastern Bradford County COG was signed and sent to Jason Krise. This is resolution 2016-5.

A resolution was also signed to have the Bradford County Office of Community Planning and Mapping Services act as the lead agent for the 2017-2021 NBIS Bridge Inspection Cycle. This was resolution 2016-6.
